- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a) Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected to the awards points for the September 2015 Cycle 228 Navy Wide Advancement Examination (NWAE).
- 2. The Board, consisting of Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 1 February 2017 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board agreed that the profile sheet for cycle 228 showed four award points in error and his record should have reflected 7 award points. The Board concurred with the advisory opinion in that after recalculation of his Final Multiple Score (FMS), it increased to 172.04, which exceeds the minimum FMS of 171.77 to be advanced. The Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.



RECOMMENDATION:

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

- a. The Petitioner's profile sheet for the September 2015 Cycle 228 NWAE to reflect "7" award points vice "4" award points. Note: After recalculation of his FMS it increased to 172.04, which exceeds the minimum FMS of 171.77 to be advanced to CTR1 from the September 2015 Cycle 228 NWAE. The Petitioner took the March 2016 cycle 231 NWAE and advanced to CTR1 effective 16 Dec 2016.
- b. The Petitioner's effective date of advancement to CTR1 is to reflect "16 June 2016" vice "16 December 2016". The Petitioner's Time in Rate (TIR) is to reflect "1 January 2016" vice "1 July 2016".
- c. Defense Finance & Accounting Service (DFAS) will complete an audit of Petitioner's records to determine if Petitioner is due any back pay and allowances.
 - d. A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
- 4. It is certified that quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
