1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a) Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected to compare one Navy Wide Advancement Examination (NWAE) against another.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 20 June 2017 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. In correspondence attached as enclosures (2) and (3), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has partial merit and warrants partial favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosures (2) and (3), the Board agreed that the Petitioner was eligible and could not take the Cycle 232 NWAE due to no fault of her own. The Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following partial corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

The Final Multiple Score (FMS) on the Examination Profile Information and Exam Status sheet for Cycle 232 was "160.99".

That part of the Petitioner's request for corrective action that exceeds the foregoing is denied. After comparing March 2017 cycle 235 NWAE against September 2016 cycle 232 NWAE, Petitioner's FMS did not exceed the minimum FMS of 172.98 required to be advanced to CTM1.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
