1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Petitioner, a commissioned officer of the Navy, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting that her naval record be corrected by removing Cycle 1 of the 2014 PFA, Body Composition Assessment (BCA) failure from her Physical Readiness Information Management System (PRIMS) record and Official Military Personnel File (OMPF). Enclosures (2) through (4) apply.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 5 April 2017, and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Enclosure (1) was filed in a timely manner.

c. Petitioner's record contains a BCA failure for 2014, Cycle 1 of the PFA. Petitioner states she was waived for the 2014, Cycle 1 PFA but the Command Fitness Leader did not route her waiver up through the chain of command for the Commanding Officer's signature for approval of her waiver.

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d. Enclosure (3) states, in part, that there were two contending plans for the Petitioner regarding her BCA, the first was to postpone the measurement for BCA until the Petitioner had completed all of the testing and second, waive the Petitioner from the BCA without hesitation and it appeared a waiver for the complete cycle was produced and forwarded to the Command Fitness Leader (CFL).

e. Enclosure (4), states, in part, the Commanding Officer recommendation for approval of removing 2014, Cycle 1 BCA failure from the Petitioner's record.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of enclosures (3) through (5), that Petitioner's requests warrants favorable action. In this regard, the Board concludes that the BCA failure of 2014, Cycle 1 should be removed from her PRIMS record and OMPF.

In view of the above the Board directs the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

Petitioner's naval record be corrected by removing 2014, Cycle 1 BCA failure from the Petitioner's PRIMS record and OMPF.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
