- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Petitioner, a former sailor, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting that his Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) be corrected to reflect his honorable characterization of service. Enclosure (1) applies.
- 2. The Board, consisting of Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 31 October 2017 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
 - b. Petitioner was issued a DD Form 214 with a blank block 13a.
- c. Petitioner's service record, specifically his "Record of Discharge, Release from Active Duty, or Death" form NAVPERS 601-14, reflects his honorable discharge. See enclosure (2).

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board concludes that Petitioner's request warrants favorable action.

The Board notes it was administrative error to leave Petitioner's "character of service", block 13a on his DD Form 214, blank.

In view of the foregoing, the Board finds the existence of an error warranting the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

Petitioner's naval record be corrected to show that his characterization of service was honorable when discharged on 26 October 1966.

Petitioner shall be issued a new DD Form 214.

A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

Upon request, the Department of Veterans Affairs be informed that Petitioner's application was received by the Board on 24 January 2017.
