
Dear

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 11 April 2024. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion contained in Navy Personnel Command memorandum 1900 PERS-312/SA of 12 February 2024, which was previously provided to you for comment.

The Board determined that your personal appearance, with or without counsel, would not materially add to their understanding of the issues involved. Therefore, the Board determined that a personal appearance was not necessary and considered your case based on the evidence of record.

You requested that your DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty ending 26 July 1985 reflect sea service during the approximate period of October 1983 to March 1984. Additionally, you requested removal of the comment regarding needing dental care from your DD Form 214. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. Navy Personnel Command (PERS-312) has advised the Board that a DD Form 215, Correction of DD Form 214 will be issued for time served on deployment to the ________. You may request a copy of the DD Form 215 by submitting a request online at https://www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records or submitting an SF-180, Request Pertaining to Military Record to National Personnel Records Center.



As to your request to remove the comment regarding needing dental, the Board determined a changed to your record is not warranted. In this connection, the Board noted that the dental comment on your DD Form 214 would have been a proper entry at the time of discharge and you failed to provide any supporting documentation to support otherwise.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
