1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that her naval record be corrected to establish retroactive entitlement to Health Professional Officers Board Certified Pay (BCP) effective 31 December 2020.

2. The Board, consisting of **Constant and Particular**, and **Constant and Particular** reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 23 May 2024, and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. In accordance with reference (b), the effective date of BCP is effective on the date of commencement of active duty, or the date the officer becomes board certified in the specialty, whichever is later. Reference (c) specified the 1-year rate (prorated monthly) for BCP is \$6,000.

b. On 21 May 2014, Petitioner earned a Bachelor of Science in Pharma and Healthcare Studies from the second state of the secon

c. On 29 August 2019, Petitioner issued BUPERS Order: (Official New Appointment Orders) to for duty via an intermediate stop at as a student on temporary duty.

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d. On 3 September 2019, Petitioner accepted active duty commission.

e. On 14 September 2019, Petitioner entered active duty and reported to for temporary duty. Petitioner detached for the formation on 18 October 2019 and reported to for duty on 23 October 2019.

f. On 17 November 2020, Petitioner detached for duty.

g. On 31 December 2020, Petitioner issued board certification in Pharmacotherapy by the Board of Pharmacy Specialties. The certification is active through 31 December 2027.

h. On 1 March 2022, Petitioner submitted a request for retroactive BCP effective 31 December 2020 to

i. On 26 March 2022, Petitioner issued BUPERS Order: (Official Change of Duty Orders) to Office of Attending Physicians US Congress for duty.

j. On 22 July 2022, Petitioner detached and reported to Office of on 3 August 2022 for duty.

k. On 2 February 2024, Petitioner's BCP was processed with an effective date of 1 October 2023.

1. In the advisory opinion, attached as enclosure (2), commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. In accordance with references (b) and (c), Petitioner met the eligibility criteria for BCP. However, because of administrative oversight, Petitioner's BCP package was not appropriately processed, therefore the Board determined under this circumstance, relief is warranted.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner submitted BCP package in a timely manner, and it was approved by cognizant authority.

This change will entitle Petitioner to BCP with an annual rate of \$6,000 from 31 December 2020 to 30 September 2023.

Note: Defense Finance and Accounting Service will conduct an audit of Petitioner's pay records to determine pay entitlement.

That a copy of this report of proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
