The entary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of the err's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.			
error ar	Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative es available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The made the following findings:			
a. (	On 12 April 2010, Petitioner married and acquired 2-stepchildren, born born born.			
b. On 28 July 2010, Petitioner issued orders for Retirement by Reason of Permanent Physical Disability, effective 31 August 2010.				

c. On 5 August 2010, Petitioner's spouse signed DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired Personnel before a notary witness concurring with spouse's SBP election. However, Petitioner had not signed the form. This form was uploaded into Petitioner's official military personnel file without his or witness signatures and dates.



d. Petitioner transferred to the Permanent Disability Retired List (PDRL) effective 31 August 2010 and automatically enrolled in SBP Spouse and Child coverage as a result of spouse signing DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired Personnel before Petitioner.

e. O	n	, Petitioner's	child,	was born.
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- f. On 19 December 2013, Petitioner divorced \_\_\_\_\_. Notice of Entry of Judgement did not direct SBP Former spouse coverage.
- g. On 28 June 2016, Petitioner signed DD Form 2656-6, Survivor Benefit Plan Election Change Certificate requesting to suspend coverage. On 23 August 2017, the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) denied processing the request because a copy of the final divorce decree was not provided.
- h. On 3 May 2018, Petitioner signed and submitted a new DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired Personnel declining to participate in SBP with a copy of his divorce decree. On 14 June 2018, the DFAS denied processing the request indicating, "[t]he original DD2656 you provided declining SBP was invalid because you did not sign the form resulting in Auto Spouse and child coverage."

## **CONCLUSION**

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an error warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded Petitioner provided sufficient evidence to reflect his and spouse's desire to decline SBP coverage prior to transferring to the PDRL. Although the proper administrative requirements were not completed, the Board determined that under this circumstance, relief is warranted.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner elected to decline participation in SBP coverage with proper spouse concurrence prior to transferring to the PDRL effective 31 August 2010.

Note: The DFAS will complete an audit of Petitioner's pay records to determine amounts due, if any.

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
