1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records, hereinafter referred to as the Board, requesting to be issued a DD Form 214.

2. The Board, consisting of ██████████, ██████████, and ██████████, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 5 April 2024 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, and applicable statutes, regulations, policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.

c. Petitioner enlisted in the Marine Corps and commenced a period of active duty on 21 June 1968. Available service record reflects Petitioner completed his active duty obligations and was released from active duty on 17 December 1968. Petitioner's service record does not contain a DD Form 214.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and the Board determined that relief is warranted. The Board noted Petitioner's service record does not contain a DD Form 214 documenting his active service in the Marine Corps.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

Petitioner be issued a new DD Form 214, for the period of 21 June 1968 to 17 December 1968, indicating a character of service as "Honorable," separation authority as "Para 13258 MC Personnel Manual & MCO P1900.1," narrative reason for separation as "203 Expiration of active obligated service," and reenlistment code as "RE-1."

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
