1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to establish eligibility to transfer Post-9/11 GI Bill education benefits to eligible dependents.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 22 May 2024, and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. The Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act (Post-9/11 GI Bill, Public Law 110-252) was signed into law on 30 June 2008 and became effective on 1 August 2009. The bill provides financial support for education and housing for service members with at least 90 days of service on or after 11 September 2001. The act also includes provision for qualifying service members to transfer education benefits to their eligible dependents. General descriptions of the essential components of the law were widely available beginning in summer 2008 but specific implementing guidance was not published until summer 2009.

b. In accordance with reference (b), the option to transfer a Service member's unused education benefits to an eligible dependent required a 4-year additional service obligation at the time of election. Additionally, enlisted personnel were required to have sufficient time on contract to meet the additional service requirement prior to initiating their electronic transfer

election. Furthermore, the policy directed members to periodically check the status of their application; a denied transfer of education benefits (TEB) application required members to take corrective action and reapply with a new service obligation end date.

c. Reference (c) updated the TEB process by establishing an online, self-service Statement of Understanding that must be completed by all Sailors prior to submitting a TEB application effective 1 October 2018.

d. Petitioner's Active Duty Service Date is 21 September 2004.

e. On 3 September 2009, Petitioner reenlisted for 3 years.

f. On 1 May 2012, Petitioner married [REDACTED].

g. On 19 July 2012, Petitioner reenlisted for 6 years.

h. On [REDACTED] Petitioner's child, [REDACTED], was born.

i. Petitioner reenlisted on 30 November 2016 for 4 years and on 18 April 2020 for 6 years.

j. On [REDACTED], Petitioner's child, [REDACTED], was born.

k. On 10 February 2022, Petitioner submitted TEB application. The Service rejected the application on 11 February 2022 indicating Petitioner "has not committed to the required additional service time." There is no evidence that Petitioner completed the required TEB Statement of Understanding prior to submitting his TEB application.

l. On [REDACTED], Petitioner's child, [REDACTED], was born.

m. Petitioner submitted TEB applications on 2 January 2024 and 11 January 2024. The Service rejected the applications indicating Petitioner "has not committed to the required additional service time." Petitioner submitted applications with less than 4 years remaining on contract and still did not complete the TEB Statement of Understanding.

n. On 15 January 2024, Petitioner completed the TEB Statement of Understanding, however he did not have sufficient time remaining on contract to reapply to TEB.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. Petitioner met the basic eligibility criteria to transfer Post-9/11 GI Bill education benefits but failed to complete the administrative requirements outlined in reference (c). Although Petitioner did not complete the appropriate administrative requirements, the Board concluded that had he received adequate counseling, he would have completed the TEB Statement of Understanding prior to submitting his TEB application. Therefore, the Board determined that under this circumstance, relief is warranted.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner, in coordination with his command completed the required TEB Statement of Understanding on 10 February 2022 and submitted it to Commander, Navy Personnel Command for inclusion in the Petitioner's Official Military Personnel File.

Petitioner elected to transfer unused education benefits to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] through the MilConnect TEB portal on 10 February 2022.

Commander, Navy Personnel Command (PERS-311) reviewed Petitioner's TEB application and it was approved on 10 February 2022 with a 4-year service obligation.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
