1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Petitioner, a former member of the Navy, filed enclosure (1) requesting his social security number (SSN) be corrected on his DD Form 214. Enclosures (1) and (2) apply.

2. The Board, consisting of ██████████, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 24 July 2024 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of Petitioner's application together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.

c. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy and began a period of active service on 9 June 1958. His enlistment documents indicate his SSN as ██████████. He was Honorably discharged upon the Expiration of Active Obligated Service on 8 June 1962. Upon his discharge, he was issued a DD Form 214 that erroneously indicated his SSN was ██████████.

d. Petitioner contends the SSN reflected on his DD Form 214 is not correct. In support of his application, he provided a copy of his social security card that is consistent with the SSN listed on his enlistment documents.

CONCLUSION

Upon careful review and consideration of all of the evidence of record, the Board determined that Petitioner's request warrants relief. Specifically, as previously discussed, the Board noted Petitioner's DD Form 214 erroneously documents his SSN and requires correction.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner be issued a DD Form 215 indicating his correct SSN of [REDACTED]

That no further changes be made to Petitioner's record.

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
