b. (On 18 March 2011, Petitioner married and had 4-children: born on 12 October 2012, born on 27 January 2014, born on 26 November 2018, and born on 1 October 2022.
c. (On 25 August 2023, Petitioner signed the DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired

Personnel and elected SBP Spouse only coverage based on the full gross retired pay level of

- d. Petitioner transferred to the Permanent Disability Retired List (PDRL) effective 31 October 2023, and SBP Spouse only premium deductions began.
- e. On 6 August 2024, Petitioner and spouse signed SBP Affidavit indicating that they desired Petitioner's SBP election to be changed to reflect that he declined SBP coverage. Petitioner indicated that he "received insufficient SBP information/counseling prior to [his] date of retirement."

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an error warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded Petitioner was medically retired from the U.S. Navy and may not have received adequate counseling on the SBP program while going through medical processing. Therefore, the Board determined that under this circumstance, relief is warranted.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner elected to decline participation in SBP with proper spousal concurrence prior to transferring to the PDRL effective 31 October 2023.

Note: The Defense Finance and Accounting Service will complete an audit of Petitioner's pay records to determine amounts due, if any.

A copy of this report of proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
