1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting her Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) for Initial Active Duty Training (IADT) period of service. Enclosure (2) applies.

2. The Board, consisting of ██████████, ██████████, and ██████████, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 6 January 2024 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.

c. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy Reserves and began a period of active duty on 5 July 1989. There is no record DD Form 214 in Petitioner's record to document this period of active duty service. On 19 May 1997, Petitioner was honorably discharged by reason of completion of required Navy Reserves obligation.

d. Petitioner contends Navy Personnel Command (NPC) informed her that they were unable to locate her DD Form 214 for her IADT period of service. Therefore, NPC instructed her to submit an application to this Board to have it recreated. Petitioner claims she served in the Navy

Reserves under the Reserved Allied Medical Program (RAMP). Petitioner asserts she attended boot camp in July 1989 in [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and received her RAMP training at [REDACTED] Community College in the field of Non-Invasive Cardiovascular Technology. Petitioner states she attended reserve mandatory weekend drills in [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED], [REDACTED]. At the time of her discharge from service, Petitioner was attending reserve mandatory drills in [REDACTED]. Petitioner would like this correction to be made so that her military record is accurate. Petitioner is also requesting her DD Form 214 be send to her so that she may have her veteran status on her driver's license.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of the evidence of record, the Board determined Petitioner's request warrants partial relief. Specifically, the Board determined that Petitioner's OMPF record contains limited information concerning her IADT period of service. Therefore, the Board lacks the necessary evidence to recommend a specific correction to Petitioner's record. Notwithstanding, the Board determined it was in the interest of justice that NPC conducts a review of the Petitioner's records to determine if it can determine the dates Petitioner attended IADT and whether she qualified for the issuance of a DD Form 214.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action:

RECOMMENDATION:

That NPC conducts a review of the Petitioner's OMPF record and other data systems to determine the dates she attended IADT and issue a DD Form 214 for that IADT period should she meet the requirements to receive one.

That no further changes be made to Petitioner's record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.

Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
