
This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 15 April 2025. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion contained in Office of the Chief of Naval Operations memorandum and your response to the opinion.

The Board determined that your personal appearance, with or without counsel, would not materially add to their understanding of the issues involved. Therefore, the Board determined that a personal appearance was not necessary and considered your case based on the evidence of record.


In accordance with DoD 7000.14-R FMR Volume 7A, Chapter 26, Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) is paid for housing within the United States. Assignment to Government quarters affects a Service member's eligibility for BAH. A housing allowance, other than BAH-Partial or BAH-Diff, is not authorized for a Service member who is assigned to Government quarters appropriate to the Service member's grade, rank, or rating and adequate for the Service member and dependents, if any. See section 8.0 for rules regarding assignment to Government quarters.

A Service member without a dependent entitled to basic pay is authorized BAH or OHA in the situations specified in Table 26-18 and as otherwise specified in this paragraph.



Ordinarily BAH or OHA is based on the Service member's PDS and paid when adequate Government quarters are not provided at the PDS.

On 16 July 2008, you were advanced to PSSA/E-2. On 16 April 2009, you were advanced to PSSN/E-3.
On 22 July 2009, your Reporting Senior signed a Periodic/Regular Evaluation Report and Counseling Record for the period of 16 July 2008 to 15 July 2009. Furthermore, block 7 (Ship/Station) listed
On 19 January 2010, your Reporting Senior signed a Detachment of the Individual/Regular Evaluation Report and Counseling Record for the period of 16 July 2009 to 19 January 2010. Furthermore, block 7 (Ship/Station) listed.
On 19 January 2010, you transferred from and arrived at on 9 February 2010 for duty.

You requested to receive BAH-Single for vice from 6 June 2008 to 9 February 2010, the Board in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. The Board concluded that orders transferred you from to received BAH at the without dependents rate for your PDS beginning June 2008. You assert that and spent 99% of your tour working from because you were transferred to there and commuting from your residence that you were entitled to BAH based on the rate. However, the Board determined that you received the correct BAH based on the PDS listed in orders . Your record does not contain orders for a transfer, and there is no record of a request for BAH at the rate in 2008 or at any time in the 17 years since. Therefore, the Board determined there is insufficient evidence to warrant a change to your record.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
