Dear Petitioner:

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Title 10, United States Code, Section 1552.

Your application was not filed in a timely manner. A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 10 April 2025. In your petition, you stated that you recognize that the statute of limitation was three years, and that your application was outside of that time frame, but you respectfully request that the statute of limitation be waived. You did not provide any other rationale for why the statute of limitation should be waived. After careful and conscientious consideration, the Board determined this was an insufficient reason to find it in the interest of justice to excuse your failure to submit your application in a timely manner. In reaching its decision, the Board determined your request should be denied due to the length of time since your discharge from the Navy.

With respect to your request to have your two deployments to Iraq be reflected on your Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214), the Board determined that this is a form of administrative correction that should first be sought from Navy Personnel Command (NPC). Request should be submitted to: Commander, Navy Personnel Command (PERS-313) 5720 Integrity Drive, Millington, Tennessee 38055.

In the absence of sufficient new evidence for reconsideration, the decision of the Board is final, and your only recourse would be to seek relief, at no cost to the Board, from a court of appropriate jurisdiction.
