Dear ██████████,

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 7 August 2025. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion by Branch Head, Community Management Support Branch memorandum 1160 Ser B328/029 of 6 February 2025, which was previously provided to you for comment.

On 6 June 2002, you entered active duty.

On 4 July 2023, you reenlisted for 2 years with an end of active obligated service (EAOS) of 3 July 2025.

On 16 November 2023, you were issued official change of duty orders (BUPERS order: ██████████) requiring obligated service to May 2027 while stationed at ██████████ with an effective date of departure of April 2024. Your ultimate activity was ██████████ with an effective date of arrival of 30 May 2024 and projected rotation date of May 2027.

On 27 November 2023, you signed an agreement to extend enlistment for 22 months with a Soft EAOS of 3 May 2027 in order to incur sufficient obligated service to execute orders 3203.

On 16 April 2024, you transferred from [REDACTED] and arrived at [REDACTED] on 25 April 2024 for duty.

You requested to cancel your 22 month extension of 29 November 2023 and to have your EAOS and Soft EAOS reflect 3 July 2025. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that NAVADMIN 142/22 states that “[e]ffective immediately, all enlisted early out programs and new time in grade requirement waivers are hereby cancelled. Service commitments such as enlistment contracts, service obligations for accepting permanent change of station orders, advancements, bonuses, training, etc., will be fulfilled.” On 16 November 2023, you were issued orders 3203 requiring obligated service to May 2027. On 27 November 2023, you signed an agreement to extend enlistment for 22 months with a Soft EAOS of 3 May 2027. On 25 April 2024, you reported to [REDACTED] duty. The Board determined that without the 22 month extension, you would not have met the obligated service for orders 3203, which you have already executed and in accordance with NAVADMIN 142/22, your service obligation for accepting permanent change of station orders must be fulfilled. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the aforementioned advisory opinion.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
