- (2) Administrative Remarks (Page 11) 6105 counseling entry, 14 January 2016
- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting removal of the 6105 counseling entry dated 14 January 2016.
- 2. The Board, consisting of property, and previewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 18 June 2025, and pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulation within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Petitioner was issued enclosure (2), 6105 counseling entry, on 14 January 2016, after his diagnosis of adjustment disorder. Petitioner elected not to submit a written rebuttal.
- c. Petitioner contends the 6105 counseling entry at enclosure (2) should never have been uploaded to his official military personnel file (OMPF). Additionally, he contends he has been "highly advised" by senior officers to have the entry removed because "it has no business being in there." Enclosure (1).
- d. Paragraph 4006.1 of reference (b) establishes that Administrative Remarks (Page 11) should be limited to matters "forming an essential and permanent part of a Marine's military history, which are not recorded elsewhere...and which will be useful to future commanders."

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CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence, the Board determined Petitioner's request warrants relief. Noting Page 11 entries are used for administrative remarks that are not recorded elsewhere and due to the sensitive medical nature of the contents, the Board determined the 6105 counseling entry should be removed from Petitioner's OMPF.

RECOMMENDATION

In view of the above, the Board recommends the following corrective action.

Petitioner's naval record be corrected by removing enclosure (2), 6105 counseling entry dated 14 January 2016.

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
- 5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
