This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 29 July 2025. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion contained in Commander, Navy Personnel Command (NPC) memorandum and your response to the opinion.

You requested to be advanced to Yeoman First Class (YN1)/E-6 effective 29 August 2024, modification of orders to include Advance-to-Position Six (A2P6) advancement, or spot promotion to YN1 with the original 48-month tour length. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that you did not meet the criteria for advancement to YN1/E-6 under Advance-to-Position (A2P) in accordance with Navy Administrative (NAVADMIN) message 017/24. Specifically, NAVADMIN 017/24 indicates A2P Sailors compete in the MyNavy Assignment (MNA) marketplace for a billet at the next higher rank on the normal timeline relative to their projected rotation date as specified in their permanent change of station orders or as adjusted by higher authority or approved personnel action request.

A review of your record reflects that you entered active duty on 28 August 2013 and advanced to Yeoman Second Class (YN2)/E-5 effective 16 June 2017. On 30 October 2023, you submitted an order application in MNA marketplace for a YN2 billet at ██████████
██████████). On 14 April 2024, you were issued BUPERS Order: 1074 (Official Change Duty Orders) to ██████████ with a report no later than date of 30 August 2024 in the

assigned rate of YN2. You detached [REDACTED] on 23 July 2024 and reported to [REDACTED] on 29 August 2024 for duty.

The Board could not find, nor did you provide evidence in the Bureau of Naval Personnel Instruction 1430.16G or any other official policy that outlines the eligibility and/or requirement for a "Spot" promotion for an enlisted Sailor. Additionally, the Board determined that although the MNA marketplace incorrectly reflected the [REDACTED] billet with A2P6 Assignment Tracking Indicator, you only applied for seven YN2/E-5 billets, thereby never competing for a billet at the next higher rank as required for advancement under A2P. Therefore, in this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the aforementioned advisory opinion and determined a change to your record is not warranted.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
