The Board, consisting of, and and, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 14 May 2025 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.	
	e Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of and injustice, finds as follows:
	Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
	Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to the application on its merits.
	Petitioner enlisted in the U.S. Navy Reserve on 29 September 1980. On 27 October 1980, ner began a period of active duty. On 12 February 1981, Petitioner reported to On 26 October 1984, Petitioner was released from active duty.
	Petitioner contends he served honorably in an active duty role and was not issued a DD 214. He requires the DD Form 214 to substantiate his active duty service with the

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board concludes that Petitioner's request warrants relief. Specifically, the Board determined it was in the interests of justice to properly document Petitioner's active duty service. Therefore, the Board concluded the Navy shall conduct a review of Petitioner's service record, issue him a DD Form 214 based on the review, and include all awards earned during his active duty service.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action:

That the Navy conduct a review of Petitioner's record.

That Petitioner be issued a new DD Form 214, for the period ending on or about 26 October 1984, reflecting his active duty service.

No further changes be made to Petitioner's record.

A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
