d. Petitioner was discharged with an honorable character of service and was issued a DD Form 214 for the period of 8 May 1989 to 7 May 1993 due to expiration of term of enlistment. Furthermore, block 12d (Total Prior Active Service) listed the following: 6 years, 4 months, and 23 days.

e. On 15 June 1993, Petitioner reenlisted in the United States Naval Reserve for 6 years with a new contract expiration date of 14 June 1999.

f. On 14 June 1999, Petitioner was honorably discharged from the United States Naval reserve.

g. On 15 March 2023, National Personnel Records Center (Military Personnel Records) National Archives and Record Administration issued Petitioner a Certificate of Military Service (NA Form 13038) certifying that Petitioner was a member of the United States Navy from 15 December 1982 to 7 May 1993.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board agreed a DD Form 214 was to be issued for each period of active-duty service upon discharge in accordance with reference (b).<sup>1</sup> Petitioner signed an Immediate Reenlistment Contract on 10 December 1985 for a period of 4 years, however the Board was unable to determine if it listed United States Navy or United States Naval Reserve. Therefore, the Board could not identify if Petitioner remained on active duty for the period of 10 December 1985 through 7 May 1989. Therefore, the Board determined that partial relief is warranted.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner was issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) for the period of 10 December 1985 to 7 May 1989.

Note: Navy Personnel Command will determine if the above period was active duty.

That no further changes be made to Petitioner's naval record.

A copy of this report of proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

<sup>1</sup> Criteria for Issuance of DD Form 214. The DD Form 214 is prepared to cover periods of service on active duty, temporary active duty, some periods of active duty for training, certain periods terminated by a change of status not concurrent with separation from active service, and release from a status that legally determined to be void. Personnel Continuing on Active Duty. The DD form 214 will be prepared and furnished to members while serving on active duty when they have a change of status or component as follows: (a) Enlisted Personnel. 1. Discharged for the purpose of immediate enlistment or reenlistment. 2. Discharged to accept permanent appointment to either warrant or commissioned status for continued active duty.
