Dear ██████████,

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (the Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 16 January 2026. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

On 11 July 2016, you signed a Dependency Application (NAVPERS 1070/602) listing the following: Spouse and child address ... ██████████, ██████████.

On 17 July 2018, you signed a Record of Emergency Data (DD Form 93) listing the following: Spouse and child address ... ██████████, ██████████.

In accordance with MILPERSMAN 1070-271 published on 20 January 2019, this article supplements reference (a) and outlines procedures for initial entry, periodic review, and updating procedures for DD 93 Record of Emergency Data. The Service member is solely responsible for the accuracy of the information recorded on DD 93. Emergency data information is no longer recorded on NAVPERS 1070/602 Dependency Application.

Note: An unsigned and or undated DD 93 will be considered an invalid, unofficial document. Only the most current version submitted through one of the three methods described above will be used to determine beneficiaries. DD 93 must be updated when change(s) are made: 1. in dependent status (marriage, divorce, or birth or death of a child), 2. to the address of a spouse, parent, or other beneficiary.

On 25 March 2019, you were issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: ██████████), while stationed in ██████████, ██████████, ██████████ with an effective date of departure of June 2019. Your ultimate activity was ██████████, ██████████, ██████████ for duty with an effective date of arrival of July 2019 with a Projected Rotation Date (PRD) of July 2021.

In accordance with MILPERSMAN 1070-270 published on 1 May 2019, "Policy a. NAVPERS 1070/602 Dependency Application (DA) (Navy Standard Integrated Personnel System (NSIPS) form) is used for both officer and enlisted Service members and serves as a form for documenting dependency of their family member(s) for associated allowances and travel entitlements (if applicable). Previously, NAVPERS 1070/602 contained information for DA data and record of emergency data (RED). RED information from hereon will be captured and reported via DD 93 Record of Emergency Data (RED) and documented per MILPERSMAN 1070-271 and reference (a). b. When electronically signed by the Service member and approved by the authorizing official, NAVPERS 1070/602 is the official record of dependency the Navy will use to: (1) determine the relationship and dependency of individual(s) for entitlement of the person(s) approved as dependents to receive dependency entitlements per volume 7A of reference (b) and chapter 10 of reference (c). (2) provide authoritative data to Navy Personnel Command (NAVPERSCOM), Navy Casualty Office (PERS-00C) in providing funeral and or memorial service travel to the next-of-kin, as authorized per MILPERSMAN 1770-270 and 1770-271."

"When to Prepare. Prepare NAVPERS 1070/602 when a. Service member enters or re-enters the Navy or Navy Reserve following a break in service or there is a change in (1) dependent status or number of dependents (2) name or address of a dependent."

"At a minimum, commands must ensure Service members perform this verification annually in NSIPS RED/DA application via self-service; however, additional verifications are also required under the following conditions: (a) Upon reporting to a new duty station under permanent change of station (PCS) orders; (b) Prior to departure on PCS orders."

On 14 June 2019, you transferred from ██████████ and arrived at ██████████ on 28 June 2019 for duty.

Your Spouse was issued a Tuition Paid report from ██████████ for Tax Year 2019. The account address was listed as ██████████, ██████████, ██████████

On 5 February 2021, you were issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: ██████████), while stationed in ██████████, ██████████, ██████████ with an effective date of departure of June 2021. Your ultimate activity was ██████████, ██████████, ██████████ for duty with an effective date of arrival of July 2021 with a PRD of July 2024.

In accordance with the ██████████ Settlement Statement, adopted on 1 May 2021, you and your spouse are listed as the buyers of the property located at ██████████, ██████████, ██████████, ██████████

On 12 June 2021, you transferred from ██████████ and arrived at ██████████ on 6 July 2021 for duty.

On 16 April 2024, you were issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: ██████████), while stationed in ██████████, ██████████ with an effective date of departure of July 2024. Your ultimate activity was ██████████, ██████████, ██████████ for duty with an effective date of arrival of August 2024 with a PRD of August 2027. "This transfer funded for member and auth dependents as reflected on service record Page Two, per JTR Chapter 5."

On 29 July 2024, you transferred from ██████████ and arrived at ██████████ on 12 August 2024 for duty.

On 17 September 2024, Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Personnel, Manpower, and Training, N1 notified Branch Head, Military Pay and Compensation Branch (OPNAV N130) that "[i]n line with Financial Management Regulations and DASN (MMP) memo dated 18 Jun 24, due to the family disruption caused by a Permanent Change of Station, Service Members who choose to reside separately from their dependents are authorized to receive Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) for the dependent's location. In order to qualify for BAH at dependent location, the dependent(s) must be in the Continental United States (CONUS), Alaska or Hawaii, and located in the vicinity of the previous duty station or previously approved dependent location and the dependents must not have moved from that location. There are no exceptions to these requirements."

"This program is effective 1 October 2024. Members whose dependents currently reside separately from the Service Member and meet the criteria of this memo may request to receive BAH based on dependent location, however the start date for any BAH at dependent location will not be earlier than 1 October 2024."

On 17 January 2025, you signed a Record of Emergency Data (DD Form 93) listing the following: Spouse and child address ... ██████████, ██████████.

On 29 January 2025, you signed a Record of Emergency Data (DD Form 93) listing the following: Spouse and child address ... ██████████, ██████████.

On 19 February 2025, you signed a Dependency Application (NAVPERS 1070/602) listing your address as ██████████, USA, ██████████. Spouse and child address ... ██████████, ██████████. In block 49 (Remarks), the following is listed: Effective Date 20250219 Total Number of Dependents 2 Change of Address NAVPERS 1070/602 updated to change address information for: [Spouse and Son] From: ... ██████████, ██████████ TO: ... ██████████, ██████████

On 24 February 2025, PERS-451-H notified DHA ██████████ NMC that “[t]he request for BAH flexibility ICO ██████████ [█] has been received and cannot be authorized. Per the attached memo, approval for dependent location BAH, requires that the dependents must reside in the continental U.S. in the vicinity of the previous duty station (██████████, ██████████) or previously authorized location (Not applicable) and must have not moved. A review of block 49 of ██████████ [██████████] NAVPERS 1070/602 dated 19 February 2025, reflects that the dependents resided in the vicinity of the PDS (██████████, ██████████) and then relocated to the vicinity of the old PDS after the effective date of orders which makes the member ineligible for BAH flexibility. Provided member is eligible in all other respects, BAH at the with dependent rate for the members PDS (██████████, ██████████) should be the rate of eligibility.”

On 10 December 2025, you signed a Dependency Application (NAVPERS 1070/602) listing the following: Spouse and child address ... ██████████, ██████████.

On 16 January 2026, NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Center Norfolk notified the Board that “[t]he last move I am seeing in DPS and PPTAS was picked up on July 15, 2024, and delivered on August 2, 2024, from ██████████, ██████████ to ██████████, ██████████.”

You requested to apply a backdated correction for a Record of Emergency Data (DD Form 93) and Dependency Application Form (NAVPERS 1070/602). The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that MILPERSMAN 1070-271 states that DD 93 must be updated when change(s) are made in dependent status or to the address of a spouse, parent, or other beneficiary. In accordance with MILPERSMAN 1070-270, members are to verify their information on NAVPERS 1070/602 at least annually and are required to when executing PCS orders. The Board agreed that you submitted sufficient documentation to show that your family resided in the ██████████, ██████████. area since 2019, and you state that they did not relocate to ██████████, ██████████ with you because you intended to retire in 2026. However, the Board could not find, nor did you provide evidence of attempting to update either DD Form 93 or NAVPERS 1070/602 after your family joined you when you executed either orders 0849 or orders 0361. In accordance with the CNP memo published on 17 September 2024, “[t]his program is effective 1 October 2024. Members whose dependents currently reside separately from the Service Member and meet the criteria of this memo may request to receive BAH based on dependent location, however the start date for any BAH at dependent location will not be earlier than 1 October 2024.” You did not sign a new DD Form 93 until 29 January 2025, and you did not sign a new NAVPERS 1070/602 until 19 February 2025. Therefore, the Board found no error or injustice to warrant backdating either form.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not

previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
