1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to show Petitioner was reimbursed for his Personally Procured Move (PPM).	
2. The Board, consisting of reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 27 May 2025 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.	
3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:	
a. On 30 August 2024, PODS issued Petitioner a Change Order Confirmation with an original order Date of 27 May 2024.	
	On 27 November 2024, Petitioner was issued official retirement orders (BUPERS order: while stationed in with an we date of departure of April 2025 and effective date of retirement 1 May 2025.
of Rele	Petitioner was retired with an Honorable character of service and was issued a Certificate case or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) for the period of 1 October 2009 to ril 2025 upon having sufficient service for retirement.

d. On 20 February 2025, NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Center notified Petitioner that "[p]aragraph 051302 A of the Joint Travel Regulation states that transportation of HHGs at

government expenses prior to the issuance of permanent change of station orders is not authorized. Exception is made when the order issuing authority (Navy Military Personnel Command) or member designated representative provides a written statement that orders are forthcoming, and shipment may be prior to the official issuance of orders.

A review of the documentation supporting the claim shows that you initiated shipment of your HHGs on 07 Jul 2024 prior to the [27 NOV 2024] issue date of your orders. Since shipment was made prior to the issuance of orders, this office has no legal basis to permit payment of your claim."

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded per reference (b) HHG allowances are based on the when orders are effective, and certain criteria must be met in order to execute HHG transportation before an order is issued. Petitioner was preparing to retire; therefore, Petitioner had reason to believe that official retirement orders would be forthcoming.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's official retirement orders (BUPERS order:) were issued on "26 May 2024" vice "27 November 2024."

A copy of this report of proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
