1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting correction to block 20, the physical readiness block, of his evaluations covering the periods of 16 June 2021 to 15 June 2022, and 16 June 2023 to 15 June 2024.

2. The Board, consisting of ██████████, ██████████ and ██████████ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 17 December 2025, and pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. Additionally, the Board considered enclosure (5), an advisory opinion (AO) furnished by Navy Personnel Command. The AO was provided to the Petitioner on 22 April 2025. He was given 30 days to submit a response, but did not do so.

3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds the following:

a. On 2 June 2022, Petitioner was issued an evaluation covering the period of 16 June 2021 to 15 June 2022 wherein block 20 was marked with an "F."

b. On 10 June 2024, Petitioner was issued an evaluation covering the period of 16 June 2023 to 15 June 2024 wherein block 20 was marked with an “F.”

c. Petitioner’s Physical Fitness Assessment (PFA) summary report dated 7 March 2025, indicated he was deployment/operational (DEP/OP) and a Physical Readiness Test (PRT) non-participant for the first cycle of both the 2022 and 2024 PFA’s.

d. Petitioner contends the evaluations contain incorrect information and that both should indicate “N” rather than “F” in block 20, as “N” corresponds with PFA non-participant, while “F” corresponds with PFA failure.

e. As part of the Board’s review, the Board considered enclosure (5). The AO states in pertinent part: Once an evaluation has been filed in an Official Military Personnel File (OMPF), it may only be modified through administrative change or the addition of supplementary material. Corrections requested for block 20 are supplemental and require a Letter-Supplement from the original reporting senior. The original reporting senior may submit supplementary material within two years after the end date of the report. The report ending 15JUN22 exceeds this period and changes are not permitted unless otherwise directed by BCNR. PERS 32 has no objection to making the corrections if directed by BCNR.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an error warranting relief. The Board determined that for both evaluations, the correct mark in block 20 should be “N.” In making this determination, the Board relied on the clear evidence provided in enclosure (5), which confirms Petitioner was DEP/OP and a non-participate in the PFA on both occasions. The Board further found no evidence of any PFA failures in Petitioner’s record.

## RECOMMENDATION

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action:

That Petitioner’s naval record be corrected by changing block 20 of both evaluations to “N.”

That any other material or entries inconsistent with or relating to the Board’s recommendation be corrected, removed, or completely expunged from Petitioner’s record, and that no such entries or material be added to the record in the future. This includes, but is not limited to, all information systems or database entries that reference or discuss the expunged material.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board’s review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board’s proceedings in the above entitled matter.
