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This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (the Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

Although your application was not filed in a timely manner, the Board found it in the interest of justice to waive the statute of limitations and consider your case on its merits. A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 11 December 2025. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

The Board determined that your personal appearance, with or without counsel, would not materially add to their understanding of the issues involved. Therefore, the Board determined that a personal appearance was not necessary and considered your case based on the evidence of record.

In accordance with OPNAV Instruction 1900.4A published on 19 February 2019, Personnel Eligible for Full Separation Pay (non-disability). Members involuntarily separated from active duty whose separation is characterized as honorable and who meet the criteria in subparagraphs 7a and 7b, except those excluded in paragraphs 8 and 9, are entitled to the full rate of separation pay.

Minimum Service. (1) Officers on the active duty list must have completed at least 6 years of active duty service prior to separation. The qualifying years do not have to be continuous,

however, the last phase of the qualifying term must end immediately before the separation, discharge, or release.

Reserve Obligation. The Service member has entered into a written agreement to serve in the Ready Reserve for a period of not less than 3 years following separation from active duty. A member who enters into this written agreement and who is not qualified for appointment or enlistment in the Ready Reserve need not be enlisted or appointed to be considered to have met this condition of eligibility for separation pay. If the member has a service obligation remaining at the time the member is separated from active duty, the 3-year obligation will begin on the day after the date on which the member completes this obligation.

On 9 December 2020, you were issued official separation orders (BUPERS order: 3440), with required obligated service to December 2024, while stationed in ██████████ with an effective date of departure of April 2021. Furthermore, the following was listed: Member advised: if an acceptance and oath of office for a reserve appointment (NAVPERS Form 1000/4) has not been received by your command, payment of separation pay shall not occur until member signs DD Form 1070/613 (page 13 entry) containing the following statement: Date: 01 May 2021: I agree to sign an acceptance and oath of office (NAVPERS Form 1000/4) for an appointment into the Navy reserves for a period of three years after separation, if one is tendered.

You are directed to contact the career transition office (CTO) immediately at ██████████ Transition assistants (TA) located in Millington, TN (central standard time) are available to coordinate your reserve appointment and facilitate your transition from the Active Component (AC) to the Reserve Component (RC).

Your separation as a result of twice failing to select for the next higher grade and the authorization to draw separation pay is contingent upon accepting a reserve appointment (NAVPERS Form 1000/4) in the Navy reserves if one is tendered or received. However, due to administrative delay, the reserve appointment cannot be issued at this time. To receive separation pay you must sign a Page 13 (DD Form 1070/613). The servicing PSD shall contact ██████████ for the correct format and legal text.

Under 10 U.S.C. 1174, authorized to draw separation pay based on ten years, eleven months active service.

Separation payment is contingent on member signing a reserve oath of office.

Your attention is invited to the special additional information section which should be completed and contain the separation code JGB in block 26.

You were discharged with an Honorable character of service and were issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) for the period of 14 May 2010 to 30
