1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that enclosure (2), a Page 11 counseling entry dated 22 October 2024, be removed from his Official Military Personnel File (OMPF).

2. The Board, consisting of ██████████, ██████████, and ██████████, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 28 January 2026 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds the following:

a. On 22 October 2024, a Page 11 counseling entry was made in Petitioner's OMPF concerning his assignment to the Marine Corps Body Composition Program (BCP). Petitioner elected not to submit a rebuttal statement. See enclosure (2).

b. On 9 December 2024, Commander, United States Marine Corps ██████████, issued a letter to the Director, Consolidated Personnel Administration Center, informing the Director that the notification process for formal body composition assignment in the case of Petitioner exceeded the 60-day timeline established by reference (b). The letter ordered that all entries be removed from Petitioner's OMPF as a result of Marine Corps' non-compliance with the reference. See enclosure (3).

c. Petitioner contends the Page 11 should be removed because he was never assigned to the BCP.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board concludes that Petitioner's record warrants relief. Specifically, the Board determined enclosure (2) is erroneous and should be removed from Petitioner's record due to failure of the Marine Corps to comply with the timeline requirements of reference (b). The Board made no finding regarding Petitioner's contention he was never assigned to the BCP.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

(1) Remove enclosure (2), the Page 11 dated 22 October 2024, from Petitioner's OMPF.

That any material or entries inconsistent with or relating to the Board's recommendation be corrected, removed, or completely expunged from Petitioner's record, and no such entries or material be added to the record in the future. This includes, but is not limited to, all information systems or database entries that reference or discuss the expunged material.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
