Dear ████████████████████,

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 29 January 2026. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion contained in Headquarters, U. S. Marine Corps memorandum 5420 MMEA of 5 May 2025. The advisory opinion was provided to you on 20 May 2025, and you were given 30 days in which to submit a response. Although you were afforded an opportunity to submit a rebuttal, you did not do so.

You requested to be paid the FY25 Selective Retention Bonus (SRB) for Primary Military Occupational Specialties (PMOS) 1391 as outlined in MARADMIN 483/24. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. You assert that, “[i]t was clear I was Zone B and met all requirements, yet it was approved without the bonus. This it only the second year my PMOS rated a bonus, and I didn’t receive it due to an oversight by those who handle these matters regularly.” However, the Board concluded that MARADMIN 610/24 was published on 17 December 2024, stating that Marines submitting for reenlistment in several PMOSs, including PMOS 1391, Zone B after release of this MARADMIN will no longer be eligible to receive the SRB amounts listed in MARADMIN 483/24. Your reenlistment request was submitted on 6 January 2025, after your PMOS had already met its retention goals, and you accepted your reenlistment without an SRB. Thus, the Board concluded that there is no probable material error, substantive inaccuracy, or injustice warranting corrective action. Accordingly, given the totality of the circumstances, the Board determined that your request does not merit relief.

In the absence of sufficient new evidence for reconsideration, the decision of the Board is final, and your only recourse would be to seek relief, at no cost to the Board, from a court of appropriate jurisdiction.
