1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that her naval record be corrected to establish eligibility to transfer Post-9/11 GI Bill education benefits to her eligible dependents.

2. The Board, consisting of ██████████ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 15 January 2026 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, she exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. The Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act (Post-9/11 GI Bill, Public Law 110-252) was signed into law on 30 June 2008 and became effective on 1 August 2009. The bill provides financial support for education and housing for service members with at least 90 days of service on or after 11 September 2001. The act also includes provision for qualifying service members to transfer education benefits to their eligible dependents. General descriptions of the essential components of the law were widely available, beginning in summer 2008 but specific implementing guidance was not published until summer 2009.

b. In accordance with reference (c), the option to transfer a Service member's unused education benefits to an eligible dependent requires a 4-year additional service obligation at the time of election. Enlisted personnel are required to have sufficient time on contract to meet the additional service requirement prior to initiating their electronic transfer election. Additionally, the policy directed members to submit transfer of education benefits (TEB) applications into the MilConnect TEB portal and periodically check the status of their application; a denied TEB application requires members to take corrective action and reapply with a new service obligation end date. Reference (d) updated the TEB process by establishing an online, self-service Statement of Understanding (SOU). Effective 1 October 2018, all Sailors are required to complete the SOU prior to submitting a TEB application.

c. Reference (e) updated the administrative requirements to TEB and reiterated the requirements of references (c) and (d).

d. On 27 February 1995, Petitioner entered active duty.

e. On 29 June 2002, Petitioner married spouse [REDACTED] and acquired a step-children, [REDACTED] born on [REDACTED]. Thereafter, Petitioner had two children: [REDACTED] born on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] born on [REDACTED]

f. On 5 February 2013, Petitioner reenlisted for 6 years.

g. On 4 January 2018, Petitioner signed Post 911 GI Bill Transfer to Dependents, NAVPERS 1070/613, Administrative Remarks, a copy was uploaded to her electronic service record (ESR) and verified on 9 January 2018.

h. On 4 January 2018, Petitioner submitted TEB application with less than 4 years remaining on contract and requested to allocated months of education benefits to her two youngest children. The Service rejected the application indicating, "Disapproved-SM [Service Member] has not committed to the required additional service time."

i. On 5 January 2018, Petitioner reenlisted for 5 years and reenlisted on 29 September 2021 for 4 years.

j. On 12 April 2024, Petitioner's ESR reflects a 17-month extension was submitted to corporate.

k. On 15 April 2025, Petitioner resubmitted TEB application with less than 4 years remaining on contract and failed to complete the required SOU. Petitioner requested to allocated months of education benefits to her two youngest children. The Service rejected the application indicating, "Disapproved-SM has not committed to the required additional service time."

l. On 15 August 2025, Petitioner's ESR reflects a 20-month extension was submitted to corporate.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. Petitioner met the basic eligibility criteria to transfer Post-9/11 GI Bill education benefits but failed to complete the administrative requirements outlined in references (c) through (e). Although Petitioner did not complete the appropriate administrative requirements, the Board concluded that had she received adequate counseling, she would have been able to transfer unused education benefits to her dependent upon reenlisting on 5 January 2018. Moreover, the Board determined Petitioner continues to serve and has completed over 8 years of active duty since reenlisting on 5 January 2018, thereby meeting the spirit and intent of reference (b). Therefore, the Board determined that under these circumstances, relief is warranted.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner elected to transfer unused education benefits to [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] through the MilConnect TEB portal on 5 January 2018.

Commander, Navy Personnel Command (PERS-311) reviewed Petitioner's TEB application, and it was approved on 5 January 2018 with a 4-year service obligation.

A copy of this report of proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above titled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
