- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Petitioner, a former member of the Navy, filed enclosure (1) requesting her characterization of service be upgraded consistent with references (c) and (d). Enclosures (1) and (2) apply.
- 2. The Board, consisting of period, and period, and period, and period, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 19 September 2025 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of Petitioner's application together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies, to include references (b) through (d).
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.
  - c. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy and began a period of active service on 11 July 1983.

- d. On 5 April 1985, Petitioner received non-judicial punishment (NJP) for three occurrences of unauthorized absence (UA), willful disobedience of a lawful order, failure to obey a lawful order, and failure to pay just debts.
- e. On 1 April 1985, Petitioner was notified of intended administrative separation processing by reason of homosexuality, as evidenced by her admissions that she had engaged in, and intended to engage in future, homosexual activity.
- f. Petitioner consulted with counsel, elected the right to obtain copies of documents used in the separation process, and waived her remaining rights.
- g. Petitioner contends she was bullied out of the Navy for being gay. She states she did her best to serve honorably, did not know she was gay until 1984, and received harassment afterwards.
- h. Reference (d) sets forth the Department of the Navy's current policies, standards, and procedures for correction of military records following the "don't ask, don't tell" (DADT) repeal of 10 U.S.C. 654. It provides service Discharge Review Boards with the guidance to normally grant requests to change the characterization of service to "Honorable," narrative reason for discharge to "Secretarial Authority," separation code to "JFF," and reentry code to "RE-1J" when the original discharge was based solely on DADT or a similar policy in place prior to enactment of it and there are no aggravating factors in the record, such as misconduct.

## **CONCLUSION**

Upon careful review and consideration of all of the evidence of record, the Board determined that Petitioner's request warrants relief. Specifically, the Board determined Petitioner was discharged solely for her homosexuality and, despite the existence of a NJP in her record, is entitled to full relief based on reference (d).

In making this finding, the Board noted Petitioner's NJP but concluded it did not amount to an aggravating factor since she was not administratively processed for the misconduct.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner be issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214), for the period ending 26 April 1985, reflecting that she was discharged with an "Honorable" characterization of service, narrative reason for separation of "Secretarial Authority," SPD code of "JFF," separation authority of "MILPERSMAN 1910-164," and reentry code of "RE-1J."

The Petitioner be issued an Honorable Discharge Certificate.

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

That no further changes be made to Petitioner's naval record.

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
- 5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
