- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting correction to his Service Number (SN) on his Report of Transfer or Discharge (DD Form 214). Enclosures (1) and (2) apply.
- 2. The Board, consisting of and and another, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error on 22 August 2025 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.
- c. Petitioner enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserves and commenced a period of active duty on 10 October 1956. On 9 October 1958, Petitioner was honorably released from active duty and was issued a DD Form 214 that erroneously listed his SN as "and his date of entry as "10 October 1958."
- d. Petitioner contends that his SN listed on his DD Form 214 is incorrect and desires a corrected DD Form 214 so that he may receive hearing aids through the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board determined that the Petitioner's record warrants relief. Specifically, as discussed above, the Board noted Petitioner's SN and date of entry are incorrectly annotated on his DD Form 214 and require correction.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

Petitioner be issued a Correction to DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 215), for the period ending 9 October 1958, correcting Block 2. Service Number to "and Block 18.c. Date of Entry to "10 October 1956."

That no further correction action be taken on Petitioner's naval record.

That a copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
- 5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
