Dear Petitioner:

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Title 10, United States Code, Section 1552.

Your application was not filed in a timely manner. A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 18 December 2025. The Board determined your personal appearance, with or without counsel, would not materially add to their understanding of the issues involved. In your application, you requested “an honorable discharge due to a medical condition” because your “medical condition was caused by your military service.” The Board, noting you indicated “other mental health,” requested documentation supporting your assertion of a mental health condition but in response, you appear to have solely focused on your history of seizures. In reviewing your application, the Board noted you did not provide a date of discovery or explanation of your delay in requesting correction. The Board, noting you were discharged by reason of misconduct – drug abuse in March 2009, observed you did not provide a sufficient basis to excuse the failure to submit the application in a timely manner and was not willing to waive the three-year statute of limitations due to the length of time since your discharge.

In the absence of sufficient new evidence for reconsideration, the decision of the Board is final, and your only recourse would be to seek relief, at no cost to the Board, from a court of appropriate jurisdiction.
