



You requested a change to amount owed by at least 2,000 pounds for your 2024 household goods (HHG) move. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. NAVSUP reviewed your inventory, which substantiated the weight moved, but noticed additional Professional Books, Papers, and Equipment (PBP&E) items. NAVSUP sent you a copy of your inventory sheets, and you identified 476 additional lbs. of PBP&E, and 500 lbs. spouse pro gear. The Navy HHG Audit Office re-audited your move and credited you with 976 pounds of PBP&E, lowering the excess cost to \$8,121.38. The Board found no evidence to allow any further deduction in weight. In accordance with the Joint Travel Regulations, a service member must repay the Service for the cost of transporting his or her HHG in excess of the specified weight allowance. If the remaining debt creates a hardship, you may submit a Waiver/Remission of Indebtedness (DD Form 2789) to the Chief of Naval Operations (N130C). They can be reached at NXAG_N130C@navy.mil. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the aforementioned advisory opinion.
